How We Reached The Moon

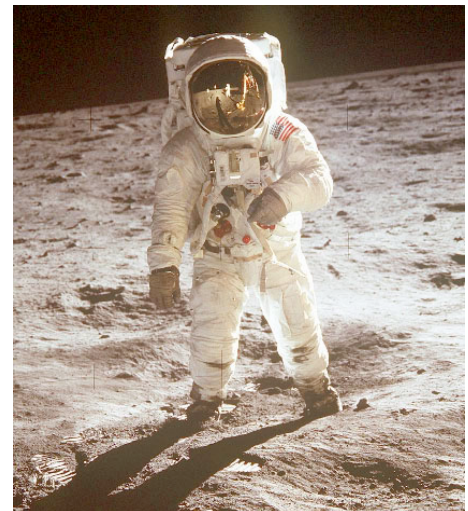
The original moon missions

The future of the American space program was given a major boost by the announcement by President Bush of a new space initiative for NASA.

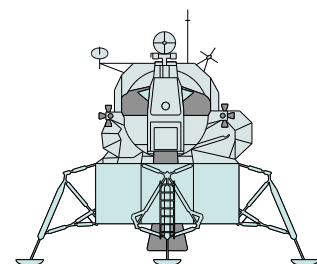
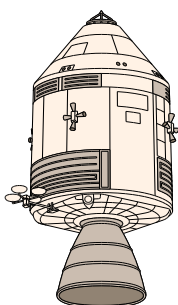
A central part of this new program involves manned missions to the Moon, but this will actually be a *return* to the Moon - more than 40 years after the last man stood on its surface.

In the 35th anniversary year of the first manned landing, this is a chance to hear how mankind originally flew to the Moon, from someone who lived through this incredible experience.



Jerry Stone has given lectures on space exploration for 35 years and presented public exhibitions since 1975. In the 1980's he was on the curatorial staff at the Science Museum, covering the Astronomy, Space and Exploration collections, including the Apollo 10 spacecraft, which was flown to the Moon in 1969. He is a member of the Mars Society UK Steering Committee, the Space Education Council and the Society for Popular Astronomy.

His special exhibition - "From the Wright Brothers to the International Space Station" - was the only event outside the USA to be recognised by the NASA Centennial of Flight Commission. In recognition of his space activities, he was elected a Fellow of the British Interplanetary Society.
